#### Objectives and activities

#### The charity's objects

The charity's objects are to promote the following charitable purposes for residents of Leeds and the surrounding area, principally those of Chinese ethnic origin by improving the living qualities, standards and harmony of the inhabitants of the area, in particular for the benefit of the Chinese community, their families and friends, but without distinction of sex, sexual orientation, race, colour or of political, religious or other opinions. They are:

The relief of poverty and sickness.

The advancement of education.

The provision of facilities for those who are in need thereof.

The provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare, recreation and leisure time occupation for the benefit of the said inhabitants, in particular to maintain and manage a Community Centre in furtherance of these objects.

#### The charity's main activities

The advancement of education. Provision of facilities at the Leeds Chinese Community Association (LCCA) Centre. To organise cultural activities for the community. To promote community cohesion and harmony and prevent isolation of vulnerable groups (e.g. elders). To improve social interaction between different social groups and different generations.

#### Public benefit statement

In setting our objectives and planning our activities our trustees have given serious consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and in particular the advancement of education, the advancement of arts, culture and heritage and community development.

#### Achievements and performance

The re-structure of the Leeds Chinese Community Association (LCCA) in 2006 brought together 8 Chinese community organisations with the same aims and objectives, which are: to provide services and facilities in the interests of social welfare, recreation, education and culture for the benefit of the Chinese community, especially in the LCCA centre.

There is now a wealth of experience and expertise within LCCA member organisations. There are pupils, teachers and volunteers from the three community schools, senior members in the Chinese community students and scholars from the University as well as members from the Yuk Ming Chinese Operatic Arts Centre.

Events organised by the LCCA during the year included:

Leeds Chinese Elderly Luncheon Club every Tuesday and Friday.

Councillor Ann Castle, Lord Mayor of Leeds, accompanied by Mr Graham Castle joined the Chinese New Year Festival 2013 at Leeds Town Hall on 10 February 2013 organised by LCCA.

Tai Chi class every Saturday at the LCCA centre, services provided by Carole Park.

Table Tennis club on every Saturday at the LCCA centre.

Meditation Class session at the LCCA centre, services provided by Carole Park.

Mid-Autumn Festival (Special meal service at LCCA).

Dementia seminars held at the LCCA centre from November 2012 to August 2013.

LCCA Elderly Luncheon Club and Social Club members visited the Chinese Arts Centre in Manchester.

Lion Dance Troupe set up (a new Lion Dance Costume blessing).

Chinese Opera session every Monday at the LCCA centre, services provided by Yuk Ming Hin.

#### Trustees' report (continued) for the year ended 31 March 2013

#### Financial review

Net expenditure for the year was £2,391, including net expenditure of £4,832 on unrestricted funds and net income of £2,441 on restricted funds.

#### Reserves policy

The charity's free reserves, excluding fixed assets, at the year end were £30,410.

The LCCA wishes to have the following reserves policy, the trustees having borne the following factors in mind:

- 1. Good practice guidelines about charitable reserves.
- 2. The need to have reserves to cover future fluctuations in income.
- 3. The need to cover refurbishment, repairs and renewals.
- 4. The need to cover unforeseen expenditure.
- 5. The need to cover planned developments.

#### Policy:

- a) The Association aims to build up its reserves to cover 2 months total operational costs over the next two years.
- b) The amount shall be reviewed annually to ensure that this minimum requirement can be adhered to and takes account of the Association's changing needs and circumstances.

#### Statement of trustees' responsibilities

The trustees (who are also the directors for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Trustees report and the financial statements in accordance with the applicable law and UK Accounting Standards.

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources. including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for the year. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;

observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;

make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;

state whether applicable UK accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;

prepare the accounts on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and to enable them to ensure that the financial accounts comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

#### 1 Accounting policies

#### **Basis of accounting**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005), the Companies Act 2006 and Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

There has been no change to the accounting policies since last year.

No changes have been made to the accounts for previous years.

#### Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the charity becomes entitled to the resources, the trustees are virtually certain they will receive the resources and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

#### **Grants and donations**

Grants and donations are only included in the SOFA when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the resources.

Where grants are related to performance and specific deliverables, they are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by its performance.

#### **Expenditure and liabilities**

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out the resources.

#### **Taxation**

As a charity the organisation benefits from rates relief and is generally exempt from income tax and capital gains tax but not from VAT. Irrecoverable VAT is included in the cost of those items to which it relates.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets costing more than £1,000 are capitalised and included at cost including any incidental expenses of acquisition. Gifted assets are shown at the value to the charity on receipt. Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost on a straight line basis over their expected useful economic lives as follows:

Freehold buildings: over 50 years

Property improvements: over 15 years

Equipment: over 5 years

#### **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the accounts.
